From the Desk of the Superintendent

Update on our District Equity Goal

Goal 4: Identifying and removing institutional barriers, and creating access and opportunities to foster the success of our students. Promote equality of educational opportunities and reduce the disparity of results between diverse groups of students.

I am extremely happy with the progress we have been making in our Equity work despite dealing with the pandemic. The district has put together a Culturally Responsive Teaching (CRT) team made up of 20 staff members throughout the district. The committee meets one time per month. In October the CRT team did equity training with Dr. Lauren Kelly from Rutgers University. In January Dr. Kelly will be training the entire South Hunterdon teaching staff on how to have conversations with students that revolve around race and equity. The CRT team will then be facilitating additional activities with staff in February that focus on equity. We have also established sub-committees for the CRT team that are focusing on the following:

- Professional Development for staff
- Curriculum Review using the <u>CRE</u> scorecard
- Data team create performance indicators, methods to measure the impact of our work.

The team is also working on a professional library for staff that will increase knowledge, awareness and instructional practices in the area of equity.

We implemented this year a new Social Justice elective course for 11th and 12th grade students. We are planning some additional student programs in the 2nd half of the school year specifically around the use of the N word; however, we feel strongly that this programming needs to be in person rather than virtual. We are planning for September 2021 so that all 9th grade history classes will have a component that focuses on race and racial literacy.	




