Upcoming Board Meeting

The Board of Education meeting this Monday, May 24 will be an in-person meeting at 7 pm in the high school cafeteria. Moving forward all of our board meetings will be going back to in-person meetings. I realize over the last year the level of community engagement for our virtual board meetings has increased significantly. Our technology department is currently working on a plan so that we will be able to live stream our board meetings to the community as well as provide a format for community members watching at home to provide public comment. Our goal is to have this in place by August.

Referendum Update

We are continuing to move forward with our referendum planning and will be submitting our current plan for a district PreK-4 school in Lambertville and new 5-8 middle school on the high school campus to the Department of Education for review. The vote for the referendum will be on Tuesday, November 2, 2021.
