## Hip Hop Fundamentals

All South Hunterdon Regional Middle/High School students in 7th-9th grades and 10th-12th grades each attended an assembly program with Hip Hop Fundamentals on Friday, February 18th. The program was funded through a grant awarded by the Lambertville Area Education Foundation (LAEF) and focused on the American Civil Rights Movement as seen through the eyes of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. Through dance, song, and audience participation, students learned some of the ways leaders and citizens stood up non-violently against racial segregation until laws were changed. Racism was defined in the equation "Racism = Prejudice + Power" and "peace, love, and unity" were expressed as values that promote positive change along with fun through the use of Hip Hop.
