The Hovercraft Project

One-hundred 5th and 6th grade students from Lambertville Public School and West Amwell Elementary School traveled to South Hunterdon Regional High School in late October for a day of critical thinking and teamwork as they built hovercrafts in the gymnasium!

The Hovercraft Project models science, teamwork and leadership to 5th and 6th grade students across the United States through a fun, participatory and immersive learning experience. This 5-hour program aligns with the New Jersey State Learning Standards for both 5th and 6th grade science under Science and Engineering Practices.

Made possible by an <u>LAEF</u> grant, the project encouraged students from both elementary schools to think critically and problem solve as members of a team. Students created a team name and flag before measuring and cutting their hovercraft skirt. After assembling their crafts and performing tests, they competed in a push competition for prizes and further modified their creations. Some even invited eager adults for a ride!
