## The Hovercraft Project

One-hundred 5th and 6th grade students from Lambertville Public School and West Amwell Elementary School traveled to South Hunterdon Regional High School in late October for a day of critical thinking and teamwork as they built hovercrafts in the gymnasium!

**The Hovercraft Project** models science, teamwork and leadership to 5th and 6th grade students across the United States through a fun, participatory and immersive learning experience. This 5-hour program aligns with the New Jersey State Learning Standards for both 5th and 6th grade science under Science and Engineering Practices.

Made possible by an **LAEF** grant, the project encouraged students from both elementary schools to think critically and problem solve as members of a team. Students created a team name and flag before measuring and cutting their hovercraft skirt. After assembling their crafts and performing tests, they competed in a push competition for prizes and further modified their creations. Some even invited eager adults for a ride!
