

WHAT DO YOU ENJOY MOST ABOUT TEACHING?



It's all about the connections for me - connections with students especially, but also with my peers and the community. I knew I wanted to teach long before I knew I wanted to teach music, but it's a wonderful subject to facilitate those connections over multiple years.

WHAT DO YOU THINK IS THE MOST IMPORTANT THING A TEACHER CAN DO FOR THEIR STUDENTS?
