

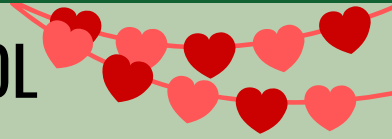

★ Multilingual Learners ★

It has become a wonderful tradition at LPS to create diverse language experiences for our multilingual learners (MLs).

In the fall, when the third grade MLs were learning about healthy habits and procedural writing, they created a recipe for a healthy snack. At the end of the unit they made that snack using their recipes. Mrs. Nadeema Hassan, our Mashio's cook, was super helpful in preparing the ingredients and setting the work table for the students.

In January, when the fourth grade MLs were learning about cultural traditions of Native Americans, they reflected on their own traditions. At home, they interviewed their parents, wrote a family recipe of tortilla making, and made tortillas. This time, Mrs. Hassan organized everything for making tortillas and baked them for the students. She was joined by Mr. Rodolfo Orozco, LPS Maintenance/Custodian. He shared with the students how tortillas are made in Guatemala, where he is from.
